PAUL FOX rolls a 300 GAME at BEXLEYHEATH


Bowling in the Olympic League recently, **Paul Fox** became the third bowler to bowl a sanctioned 300 game at Bexleyheath. The previous bowlers to achieve this rare feat were Chris Skudder in 1996, also bowling in the Olympic League and Adam Sharp, from Airport Bowl, in the 1996 "Coach and Four" Tournament

25 year-old Paul Fox has been bowling since he was eighteen and bowls in two other leagues at Bexleyheath, the Invicta Men of Kent and the Round Table.

Living in Charlton, Paul has bowled for London in the Inter-Counties.

Obviously pleased with his 300 game, he was disappointed not to beat his own personal best series of 770 scoring a mere 696.

The proprietors of the Bowl, First Leisure Corporation presented Paul with a cheque of £300 in recognition of his 300 game which was one of the last gestures from First Leisure who have subsequently sold all their Bowling Centres to Allied Leisure.





KENT LADIES qualify for the FINALS of the INTER-COUNTIES.

The Kent Ladies team has somewhat unexpectedly qualified for the Finals of this year's Inter-County Finals to be held at Nottingham over the weekend of 6th/7th November.

Normally two teams from each of six groups qualify for the finals, but as one Northern Group had only five Teams, the rules state that one Team can go through to the Final and the remaining place shall be filled by the Team having the highest average game pinfall which was Kent.

INTER-COUNTY TOURNAMENTS in 2000.

As reported in the last edition of Bowling News, the format of both the Regular and Senior Inter-Counties is to change in the year 2000. The qualifying round for each Competition will be held over a single weekend when twelve Counties will compete with the top three going through to the Finals. The regular event is scheduled for September 2000 and the Seniors for early June 2000. The draw for the Groups took place at the recent Area Secretaries Convention and the Group containing Kent is:-

Bedfordshire
Devon
Essex
Hampshire
Hertfordshire
Isle of Wight
Kent
Middlesex
Oxfordshire
Peterborough
Surrey
South Wales

At the Meeting last year when the change of format was agreed, there was only one County that voted against the proposals and that was Kent.

When we now look at the Grouping and considering that a Bowl with a minimum of 26 lanes will be required, there is a chance that Kent may have to travel to a Bowl such as Plymouth in Devon or Cardiff in South Wales, which will mean that the teams will have to stay away on two nights, i.e. Friday and Saturday, to be ready for registration on Saturday morning. This will affect the costs considerably and will be beyond the resources of K.T.B.A. Conversely, it could be staged at Airport Bowl where Kent would not need an overnight stay but teams from Devon and Hampshire will. We understand that at least two Counties have already indicated that they will not participate in the Inter-Counties in 2000 because of the increased costs.

The venues for the qualifying rounds have not yet been announced and your Council is endeavouring to find this information before we hold the Trials so that we can inform everybody concerned as to the costs involved.

We are anxious that the Inter-Counties should be open to everybody and not just to those who can afford to pay out extra costs for overnight accommodation should the Centre chosen be some distance away from the County.

We trust that the organisers monitor the Competition in the year 2000 and that an opportunity is given to all participants to discuss the format for the following year should our fears be realised.
