# STEVE BROUGH & DANIEL HARMAN break the COUNTY MENS DOUBLES RECORD

Steve Brough & Daniel Harman, bowling for the Tuggit and Stroke It Team in the Monday Doubles League at AMF Margate, have smashed the Kent County record for a Doubles team by 68 pins.

In their total of 1462, Steve weighed in with a massive 811 series, bowling 275, 290 & 246, narrowly missing a perfect game due to a spare on the first frame of his second game. Steve is only the second person to bowl an 800+ series at Margate.

# **CLUB TOURNAMENT 1999-2000**

The Club Tournament for 1999-2000 took place at Bugsy's, Cliftonville on the 14th and 21st January. I will start my report with a brief explanation about the tournament. Entry is by invitation only – bowlers have to achieve a qualifying score in the previous bowling year (1st September to 31st August). There are four Clubs with defined criteria that governs the qualification:

200 Club - Individual game by player with average of 159 or below \*

**500 Club** - Series of 500 or over bowled by ladies only

550 Club - Series of 550 and over by player with an average of 169 or less \* 600 Club - Series of 600 and over by any bowler

\* Where a qualifying average is required it should have been bowled over 21 or more games. At the beginning of the season use last season's average.

The score **must** be recorded in a BTBA sanctioned league or tournament.

If you bowl a qualifying score your league secretary will send the details to me as Area Secretary. I will pass the lists of latest qualifiers to Jerry Lodge for publication in Bowling News. (At this point I apologise to those who have qualified recently – my workload has been so high that I have not been able to collate the details yet).

The tournament in January was for players who qualified between 1st September 1999 and 31st August 2000. If you have rolled a qualifying score since 1st September 2000 then check that your League Secretary has submitted the details (or is intending to) and you could be among the winners next January!!

The Club tournament was most enjoyable and a lot of good scores were achieved. As expected, the highest scores were rolled in the 600 Club, which is played over two consecutive scratch series (the 200,500 & 550 are all over three games). **John Smith** (Cliftonville) bowled the winning score in the first week of the tournament. He started with a superb game of 275,

which was the highest rolled in the entire tournament. His two series of 693 and 638 gave him a cumulative total of 1331. At the end of play on the first week Chris Smith (Cliftonville) was lying in second place with a 1242 total. The second week found both of these scores being threatened as Jeff White got into his stride, finishing his second game with nine strikes in a row for a 269 game. His run of strikes continues for the first three of the third game and, with continuing good form he finished with a 694 series - highest of the tournament. The change of lanes obviously didn't suit him as his two series total of 1241 put him into third place, just one pin behind Chris Smith.

Of the ladies taking part in the tournament the highest game was the 215 rolled by Carole Lakin (Whitstable) in the 550 Club – Carole's 551 series put her into fourth place, just out of the prize money. The highest series was the 566 rolled by Emma Drury (Bexleyheath) in the 200 Club but Emma's 614 handicap series was only good enough to place her 8th. Linda Allerton (Margate) rolled the second highest ladies series with a 556 in the 500 Club – her 628 handicap series won her the title.

It was good to see a bowler from Orpington in the prizes. Matt Yates found the conditions to his liking and bowled a super 595 series (709 including handicap) and finished in the top slot in the 200 Club.

On the 8th February this year the last week of the Olympic League took place at Bexleyheath, with the top three places already decided on favour of The Highwaymen, Glaze-Rite and The Mean Machine respectively the only thing left to play for was some prize money and a bit of pride. Well on this last week The Highwaymen played The Mean Machine on lanes 15 & 16 (should have been 19 & 20 but we had the usual breakdown.)

Steve Carnall showed the way in the first game for The Highwaymen with a 256 and the rest of the team making their score up to 988 scratch. The MM, not to be outdone (well scratch anyway) had a 989 but lost out on handicap. In the second game Keith Hodge, John Hinch and Bob Hayter all had 200's, 233,209 & 203, this was equalled by The Highwaymen, Steve Carnall, Alan Jones & Phil Eldridge, 246, 246 & 210. The MM had a 1031 scratch, 1054 with handicap, but The Highwaymen had 1044 scratch and 1113 handicap. And so, to the last game The Highwaymen had three more 200 games, Steve Carnall, Alan Jones and Steve Clark 258,215 & 202, but this time they were surpassed by the MM with all five bowlers having 200's, Steve White 246, John Hinch 235, Neil Webb 218, Bob Hayter 216 and Keith Hodge 207.

In this game MM finally won a point defeating The Highwaymen 1122 scratch 1145 handicap to 1013 scratch 1082 handicap. To save anyone who might be adding up Steve Carnall's three games he had a very good 760 (shame that he did not bowl enough games to qualify for the high series). So on this night the MM bowled 3142 scratch with all five bowlers making 600's and lost two out of three games and the overall with handicap but, breakdowns apart, a good night was had by all. Steve stepped up for the crucial 12<sup>th</sup> frame having taken numerous bits of advice as to what he should do! I doubt if he heard a word! Down the ball went and from the obvious crowd response you wouldn't have put your mortgage on it. As yours truly was one of four bowlers in mid-frame on lanes 9 to 12 I gather from various "eyewitnesses" it went heavy on the Brooklyn side leaving the 2 and 4 pins - nevertheless a 298 has to be a great effort.

As an aside to the outcome it must be noted that Steve underwent back surgery three years ago and up till two years ago bowled a "back-up" ball off the wrong foot! These facts give a great example to the majority of bowlers that with a little time plus a lot of effort and enthusiasm anyone can reap the benefits.
