BERT AND VICKY TIMMS MEMORIAL MIXED DOUBLES TOURNAMENT

The KTBA tournament with the longest title was this year held at Whitstable on the bright and sunny day of 28 October 2001. Due to temporary staffing problems at AMF Whitstable, (one of the mechanics was taken ill suddenly and rushed to hospital) the original six squads were cut to five, the first squad being held at 10.45am.

At the end of that squad, the early leaders were father and daughter, Jack and Sam Denne who scored a total handicap score of 1293, including a 203 scratch game by Sam in the third game. Other 200+ games in that squad came from Kevin Franks, Margaret Shrimpton and Tim Beale.

The second squad at 12.00pm included no less than seven teams from one of the new centres, Tunbridge Wells. This was largely due to the fine efforts of Belinda Eason who made all the arrangements for their bowlers. Well done!

Pat Burr and Bill Potter from Whitstable scored 1062 in the scratch section taking the lead and they were only six pins behind Jack and Sam's handicap score. Like Sam, Pat's score also included a game of 203. The only other 200+ game in this squad came from Tunbridge Wells bowler Ian Jordan. Although not quite getting 200, Barry Russell from the same centre scored three excellent games of 191, 191 and 195. Not bad for someone who had never visited Whitstable before! A scratch series of 577.

The third squad at 1.45pm went by with no change to the leaderboard and 200+ games being scored by Peter Myhill and Tony Gamble, whose 214 was the highest of the day so far.

After a lane dressing the fourth squad started at 3.00pm and proved to be the highest scoring squad on the day, with a team average of 960+ scratch. The scratch total of Pat Burr and Bill Potter was overtaken by Carole Lakin and Peter Myhill with 1090, a score which proved later to be unbeatable. Carole scored games of 208, 209 and 194 for a scratch series of 611. Excellent!

Other 200+ games came from Rodney Gibbs and Vanessa Ross who both managed to sandwich the game between two games approximately 100 pins less! Rodney's scores were 137-236-139 while Vanessa managed 118,214 & 128. A notable feat indeed.

The final squad at 4.15pm began the day with only two entries, but reentries on the day filled the squad and if Whitstable had suddenly managed to acquire a further ten lanes, these would also probably have been taken. In fact, at the entry closing date of 12 October 2001, there were only 23 teams entered but by the end of the tournament, 47 out of a possible 50 teams took part.

Although the leaders of both squads were not seriously challenged in the squad we did see the second and fourth highest scratch series of the day. Dave Ross scored 585 and Michael Rich had 573. Both had a 200+ game and Mike Eason had the third 200+ game with 215.

And so to the final playoff. A new format for the tournament saw the introduction of a knockout competition to decide the trophy winners. Since it was impossible to bowl in the two sections at once, the top four scratch teams were excluded from the handicap section leaving the next four highest handicap teams to play for the memorial shield.

The Kent Ladies came home with Silver Medals from the finals of the Senior Inter-Counties held at Megabowl, Chester in October.

At the last minute Peterborough Ladies withdrew from the Tournament, which left nine teams, but it was agreed that each team would bowl a blind score game for pinfall. The usual scoring system still applied in all the Inter-County events was used whereby two points were awarded for a win to which was added 1% of pinfall, including age bonus.

Four games were scheduled for the Saturday afternoon and Kent opened by losing to Leicestershire even though they recorded their second highest score of the weekend. Sandy Sawyer had a 202 game, Angie Thick 200 and Doreen Lodge 198. Tailing off slightly, the Ladies lost to Cheshire but had their first win in Game three against Lancashire by the narrow margin of eight points. Losing to London in the last game of the afternoon, Kent was lying fifth and a lot of hard work was required on Sunday if any medals were to be won. The usual banquet at the Hotel on Saturday evening was enjoyed by all and all the arrangements for the

Results from other teams were going our way and Kent moved into third place. The next game was against the eventual champions, Berkshire, who won all their games to take the Gold Medal. The Kent Ladies ran them really close losing by only 11 pins, dropping them down to fourth spot. Next came our bye and the team manager, Alan Petherick, played his trump card by using the bowlers with the maximum age bonus and the useful resulting score brought Kent back to third place. In Game Eight, Sandy Sawyer rolled a 214 game and was well supported by the rest of the team to gain a comfortable win whilst Essex were beating the nearest rivals, London, leaving us in third place behind Hampshire. Going into the last game, Berkshire could not be caught but Kent were bowling against Hampshire, so their fate was in their own hands. The team bowled really well to record their highest game for an easy win to take them into the silver medal slot.

Week One saw Daniel 'Fingers' Harman show his intentions with a 733 scratch series, (733 with handicap, tough luck eh), followed by his brother Christopher Harman with 673. (610 scratch). Andy Allerton came in third with a 625 series (again scratch). James Barth came in fourth with 604 (517 scratch)

Margate bowlers, Daniel Marsh bowling for the Perfect Storm, and Daniel Harman for the "X" Men, have been blowing away the opposition in the Monday Night Blockbusters League at AMF Bowl in Margate.

On Monday 24th September 2001, Daniel Marsh narrowly missed out on a perfect 300 game. With the first 11 strikes looking solid, a solitary 5 pin came between him and perfection for a

299 game.

However, not to be outdone by this Daniel Harman has achieved the feat of becoming only the tenth person [12th. Ed.] in Kent to achieve the perfect score. The day was Monday 15th October 2001, and following a 709 series in the previous Grand Prix Singles league, Daniel stepped to the lanes with partner Steve Brough to start again. His first game was 218, his second game was 255 and then it came. Twelve strikes in a row for a perfect 300 game. This gave Daniel a lifetime best series of 773.

Daniel said "It is absolutely fantastic, I will be talking about it for weeks to come". I had previously bowled a 299 game and I know how nervous I was then, but to finally get the big one is beyond words".

Daniel and Steve are currently in second place in the league behind the Hellraiser team of Euan Jennings and Daisy Aldred.

Margate YBC 2001

The first week saw 29 bowlers returning from last year's league, all wearing their new shirts and mostly equipped with their sparkling bowling balls which they all received last time round.

After the chaos of finding their partners for the all exciting Trios league it was down to business, and down to business it was, eight people improving their High games, and 11 people bowling High series.

Too Good proved to be too good for the opposition Bowlinators, (Robert Nichols PB Series 252, and Nick Owen PB game of 182 and PB Series of 456), with Too Good Captain Catherine Smith bowling a personal best series of 288, and Duncan McGinley narrowly missing out on his first 500 series with games of 151,171(pb),170, for a 498 series.

Little and Large found it tough going despite a PB series of 336 and 145 from Nick Craft an Terri-Mai Nicholls respectively, against the experience of SSI (Simon Boothby bowling a personal best 480 series). IOWA struggled to find their feet against another very experienced team of Three Amigo's. The Pin Crushers had a hard fought game against Strike It Lucky who game out on top after a PB game of 155 and PB series of 405 from Jamie Lambert. Young Guns, Strike Attack, rounded off the weeks games cruising to victory against the Tenpin Terrors thanks to a game of 148 from Ross Solly which included four strikes in a row, giving him also a new high Series of 308.

Week Two saw pretty much the same improvements. This week eight people improving High games, and again 11 people recording new High series. Match One saw the Bowlinators beat Little 'n Large. All three bowlers for the bowlinators threw high series Adam Oades 176, Robert Nicholls 276, and Nick Owen 457. Little N Large bowler Terri-Mai Nicholls again bowled her best series, this time of 145. Match Two saw Simon Boothby of SSI bowl a high game of 194 (five X's in a row), giving him a high series of 522. Match Three drew together Tenpin Terrors against Too Good, and for the second week running Too Good were too good. Again Catherine Smith bowled a PB Series (344), with this week a high game to go with that of 163. Christopher Boothby also bowled a high game and series of 156 and 384 respectively. Match Four was the Pin Crushers up against Strike Attack. Joseph Turner bowled a high game in this match of 98, and also scored a high series of 256. Match Five saw IOWA take all points from team one. Match Six was a top of the Table clash between Strike it Lucky and Three Amigo's, with neither team dropping a point yet. There mist have been a lot of tension in this game as the scores showed, however Strike It Lucky remained unbeaten after this encounter taking all four points.

Tough lane conditions this week created a low scoring round with only two people, bowling personal best scores. Too Good had a very tough game against Pin Crushers with Matthew Hibbs for the Pin Crushers scoring a high game of 155 and a high series of 383. Strike it Lucky again remained unbeaten taking all points, with Ben Southworth bowling a PB 187 game, and a PB series of 523 (187,184,152). Strike Attack shared the points with Bowlinators in a mid table clash.

Lane conditions back to normal this week. Four Personal Best Games, and eight High series. IOWA played against Tenpin Terrors, and despite a personal best game of 202 from Duncan McGinley and a PB Series of 331 from James Smith, they went down 3-1. This was thanks to a personal best game of 150, and PB Series of 373 from Karl Baldwin, and a PB game and series of 113, and 274 from Thomas Read in the Tenpin Terrors team. Little and Large are not having much luck in the at present. Nick Craft this week bowled a PB series of 349, but the team still went down 4-0 to the Three Amigo's thanks to games of 182,179 and 197 from Alex Grace giving him a high series of 558. Pin Crushers took all four points in their fixture this week. Jamie Lambert scored a PB 177, equalling his high series of 405 for Strike It Lucky, helping his team take three points in their encounter with Bowlinators. This was despite Robert Nichols Bowling a high game of 99, and Nick Owen recording his high series of 470.

Strike Attack were blown away this week, against the strong SSI team lead by Ian Whitbread. Ian this week bowled his Highest series of 633, including games of 197, 232, 202), and after four weeks is leading the averages with 173.

In the final game this week. Christopher Boothby equalled his high game of 156, whilst bowling his high series of 417.

STEVE LETCHFORD wins JUNIOR ENGLAND TRIALS

This year's Junior England trials took place at AMF Nottingham on 29th/30th September. The top 24 juniors from the NAYBC merit table were invited to play in the event. The format was that each bowled played a total of 24 games, and in each game the player with the highest pinfall received 24 points down to the lowest player who received one point. At the end of the tournament, the top six would be given a place in Team England due to play in the European Championships in Rome, Italy next August.

Kent was represented by Ben Frost and Steve Letchford. At the end of the first day's bowling (12 games) Steve had taken a commanding 22 point lead over the rest of the field, with Ben in 15th place but still in contention of making the top six.

On the second day Ben put up a valiant effort but unfortunately for him he finished in a very creditable 12th place. Ben still has two years of junior bowling left, so he has every chance of making the team in future years. Steve managed to retain his lead, with a game to go he was 34 points clear of second with only 24 points available per game so he had won with a game to spare. Steve's average over the whole event was 202.9 and Ben's was 185.8.

We wish Steve the best of luck in Italy next year, and hope he brings home the gold medal for Team England.

JUNIOR AREA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The highlight of the Kent Junior Area Championships held at AMF Margate on 4th November was the individual 300 game bowled by fifteen year old **Kevin Franks** from Whitstable - only the second 300 ever bowled by a Kent Junior, the first having been recently by Steven Letchford just before his eighteenth birthday.

The format of the tournament was the usual classified sections with each bowler having three games, except for the higher average bowlers in Divisions three and six who had six games.

The strength of Whitstable YBC was evident taking the gold medal in five Divisions and, not suprisingly, also winning the single game four-person event at the end of the day from Cliftonville and Bexleyheath.

A report in the Whitstable YBC newsletter "Gutter Press" states that they didn't want the reputation for being greedy so they didn't win Division Four, in fact the highest placed Whitstable bowler was in eighth place.
