

# SHATTERED!

# RECORDS tumble at 35th KTBA AREA CHAMPIONSHIPS.

From the very first squad of this year's Area Championships at Margate we were given warning of the serious assault on the KTBA record book which was to come. culminating in the first ever 300 game to be bowled in any of our tournaments. This ensured that the recently launched KTBA Anniversary Handbook is already out of date!

On the opening squad Cliff Dew, last years Singles and All Events Champion, set about the defence of his titles with games of 259-256-237 for a 752 series. Not to be outdone, team mate Keith Hodge, clocked up a 763 series on the very next squad, to squash the doubles record with partner Clive Mitchell. From then on records tumbled throughout the three weekends with some of the best scoring ever seen at this tournament. Other notable scores on the early squads included Paul Fox with a 652 in the doubles followed by a 688 singles, and Clive Mitchell with a 666. The ladies were also clocking up some good scores with Jan Hodge establishing an early lead in the singles with a 597, closely followed by Tracy Dew on 576. Jan then combined with Nicola Harvey for a scratch score of 1198 to lead the Ladies Doubles.

Nicola, who was due to fly out to South Africa with Team Britain a few days later, was just warming up for the Team. Her 691 series played a major part in Tutti Fruitti breaking the Ladies Team records with a scratch score of 2886. Cliff Dew rounded off his day with another good 670 series for Mean Machine to take the All Events records with a scratch total of 1996. This left just one of the regular records standing at the end of Week One.

Week Two saw both Saturday and Sunday squads as well as the Masters Championship (see separate report), a very hectic weekend for organisers.

On Saturday Simon Coppins and Dawn Lovett from Whitstable challenged for the handicap doubles with a 1292 total. Whilst in the

Ladies event Carole Lakin of Whitstable took on the Ladies Handicap Singles score with a 664 series only to be beaten by Bexleyheath's Emma Drury with a Good games were still being rolled everywhere and 600 691 total. series' were almost common place, even some of our juniors getting in on the act. 16 year old James Pateman hit a 602 singles set and then led the Bexleyheath YBC team in the final squad of the day when they recorded a handicap total of 3085 to go third in the Team event, only to be beaten on the same squad by Whitstable's Miss Able's by just three pins.

However, Saturday proved to be the hors d'oeuvres! Undaunted by the early high scoring, local team Hollywood Allstars, set about a serious assault on the scoreboard on Sunday. Using the Masters as a "warm-up" Malcolm Fuller continued his fine run in the Team event. His 656 series was beaten by one pin by his team mate Tom Sawyer whilst leading Clive Smith by six pins. Their Scratch Team total of 3166 shattered the Area Record, with Mike Luckhurst as low man on only 575! The final member of the team Chris Smith was still saving himself.

On the final squad of the day the flagging audit team were sent rushing for the record books and hi-score forms when Chris sent down twelve near perfect deliveries during the middle game of his doubles, to record the first ever 300 game of the KTBA Area Championships. Chris has competed for more years than he cares to remember in our annual event and it was fitting that he should be the player to break our duck. Other good scores rolled on the day included Spencer Davis 1894 All Events total giving him 2110 in the handicap; unfortunately Spencer didn't enter the scratch! Many bowlers hit personal best games or series and its impossible to mention everyone, but our congratulations to all those scoring well.

The final weekend of this year's event clashed with the Senior Inter Counties so the audit team was down to a bare minimum, but we don't think most of the bowlers noticed, so we must have got it right. The local howlers again came to prominence although some of the Whitstable bowlers helped themselves too.

Early honours however went to the early risers from Bexleyheath and Chatham with Neil Webb rolling a 663 singles and Keith Porter a 616. the latter giving a handicap total of 706. Keith then linked up with brother Dave in the doubles to roll a handicap total of 1325.

Local player Shane Wilson arrived with only minutes to spare for his Singles squad but the rush didn't seem to affect his game, scores of 248-235-226 folllowed for a 706 series and second in the Scratch Whitstable player Tex Singles. Moustache weighed in with a 256 game to threaten the top scores but faded in the last game.

Even the last squad of the event produced some high games with the Mixers from Chatham hitting form together to challenge for the handicap Team prizes. Their 3128 total eventually landing them second

Finally our thanks go to Hollywood Bowl for hosting this event and their prompt attention to the minor problems that we encountered along the way. Special thanks also to the audit team especially John Cudmore, and to Doreen Lodge and Angie Thick who 'warmed up' for the Masters by stuffing envelopes with handbooks in order to have them ready for presentation.

The qualifiers for the Masters, held during the Area Championships at Margate were:-

After the invited participants had been presented with their medals by the KTBA President, John Cudmore, and being the first recipients of the Anniversary Handbook, the competition began. The format was each bowler rolled four games on separate lanes and the top four bowlers went forward to a single game semi-final to qualify for the single game final.

In the Ladies Section, Lucy Cudmore started well to lead after two games of 179 & 202 by 11 pins from Christine Conner with Tracy Dew in third place and Lesley Pateman fourth. In Game Three, the same four bowlers stayed in the leading places with Lesley moving up to third, but in the fourth game, Lucy slipped to fourth spot with her worst game, with Christine Conner taking over top spot with a total of 807 [ave. 201.7] from Lesley in second and Tracy third.

The semi-finals resulted in wins for Lucy Cudmore over Christine Conner 183/168 and Lesley Pateman over Tracy Dew 173/167 and in a low scoring final, Lucy Cudmore came through by 168/153 to become the youngest ever Kent Ladies Master.

Scoring in the Men's Event was very high reflecting the scoring in the Areas with defending champion, Cliff Dew, moving into an early lead after two games on 444 from Chris Smith [432], Malcolm Fuller [423] and Adrian Conner [419]. The third game saw a challenge from Steve White who moved into joint second with Chris Smith after a 223 game but Malcolm Fuller had swept into the lead on 659 which he followed with a 259 game for a four game total of 918 [ave. 239.5] to lead from Chris Smith, Adrian Conner and a late challenger in Shane Wilson with a 244 game. In all, there were 23 games out of 40 over 200 in this qualifying round. The semi-finals produced the best game of the competition with Malcolm Fuller shading it over Shane Wilson by 238 to 236 and Chris Smith winning the other match against Adrian Conner 221 to

The final between two bowlers on their home patch resulted in an easy win for Malcolm who rolled a 262 game against Chris's 179 for Malcolm Fuller to become the Kent Master for 1997 having averaged 236.3 over his six games.
