The 1997 Inter-Counties for Juniors was again held at Coventry with 29 Girl teams and 30 Boys.

Boys.

Representing the County this year for the boys were Martin & James Pateman, Andrew Senior, Tim Beale, Nathan Clark, Darren Constable and Ben Marsh.

On the first day the boys did not start very well hitting scores of 838,817 & 791, in this five person event, which put them in 19th place, but in the second session scores of 1031 and 1032, which were the first two "one thousand" games of the Tournament, moved them up into 6th place overnight.

After a good night's rest, we came back the next morning hopeful of continuing these good scores so as to qualify in the top six places for the final. The boys hit 989 and 903 to move into fourth place with one more squad to be bowled. Waiting patiently, it proved worthwhile as they ended up in fifth place.

The Final consists of a round robin where you play each other team in the final, again in five person format, with two points for a win and one for a draw.

In the first game against Durham, the boys felt as if they threw it away losing by 40 pins scoring only 883, but in the second game they nipped Surrey by a couple of pins with 884. In the third game Kent beat Yorkshire which left us in a good position, but unfortunately the team could not overcome London when bowling their lowest game of 843., but they were lying in fourth place with one game to go. In the last game against Dorset they scored 1003 and with Yorkshire losing to London it gave the Kent Boys third place.

All the boys bowled incredibly well over the weekend, Nathan Clark topping the lot with a 189.2 average, 199 in the final, hitting games of 220, 220 & 236; Andrew Senior bowled a 231 and James Pateman 230.

Girls.

The girls this year were represented by Annalisa Edwards, Carina Machin, Julie Cudmore, Jenny Beale, Helen Perkins, Lisa Wraight and Rebecca Ward.

This year the girls improved again finishing in tenth position which was very respectable in an extremely hard competition. They bowled very consistently over the weekend, also bowling in a five person team format.

On Saturday their game scores were 712, 818 & 786 in the first session followed by 752 & 786 in the evening, but they improved to their best on Sunday with games of 867 & 814. Certainly a squad for other counties to look out for in the future.

My father, Richard, Lucy and I would like to thank all the bowlers and supporters for making the weekend so enjoyable and for doing the County proud.

EDITORIAL.

One of the most difficult tasks of the Association is the selection of teams to represent the County. This applies at all levels as we now have competitions in the following age groups.

B.T.B.A. Regular Inter-Counties [no age limits]
Senior Inter-Counties [50 years and over]
NAYBC Junior Inter-Counties [under 18 years old]
Junior Inter-Counties [under 14 years old]

The selection of the Junior Teams is the responsibility of the Junior Sub-Committee following a Roll-Off in the early part of the year and continuous assessment throughout the year.

For the two Adult competitions, a Roll-Off is held in the Spring and the Kent County Organiser then makes selections in conjunction with the Team Captains appointed by the KTBA Committee.

The 1998 Roll-Off will be held at Whitstable on 15th & 22nd February 1998.

All the League Averages for the County are regularly updated and the latest rankings appear on the opposite page. These are useful to the Committee as it highlights those who have the potential to bowl for the County and they are canvassed before the Roll-Off. From watching the Inter-County events over many years, it is obvious that having a high average in a League does not guarantee that bowler will necessarily perform well in the Counties, which is a totally different format and atmosphere from league play. It is a five-person event which lasts up to seven hours in a day staged in a Bowl unfamiliar to most of the competitors, where bowlers have a long time to think about their game and their contribution to the Team. However, you never know whether you are good enough until you try. As can be seen by the new entries in the rankings new bowlers are appearing in the County and there were several new members in our County Team this year, including three Juniors.

Please support your County by entering the Roll-Off and endeavouring to make the County Team.

CLUB REGISTRATION 1997

The criteria for qualification is:-

200 Club - One game by a player with an average of 159 and below or by a first year bowler.
