TRIUMPHANT WEEK-END for "KENT" LADIES at the FINALS of the SENIOR INTER-COUNTIES

The performance of the Kent Ladies Team in the Senior Inter-Counties Finals, held at Wellingborough, was of the highest order.

The usual format for Seniors applied whereby a bonus pin was added to each individual score for every year of age over 50.

The Ladies played in four-person Teams with a round robin against all the other Counties with five games on the Saturday and four on Sunday.

The first game that Kent played was their narrowest of wins in the Tournament by 717 pins to 704 against Middlesex with Jackie Playford anchoring strongly with a 192.

Game Two was also close being a win by 14 pins over Essex, this time Jackie rolling a 202. A more comfortable win in Game Three against Dorset when Sandy Sawyer bowled a 204 game saw Kent losing their first place in the Tournament to the only other unbeaten Team, Yorkshire by the narrow margin of five pins. Game Four saw an easy win against Lincolnshire and then came the most important game to finish on Saturday against Yorkshire, who were the hot favourites to take the Title.

The game was close for the first eight frames, but Yorkshire pulled away at the end to win 713-679, but overnight Kent retained their second place comfortably ahead of Essex who were lying third.

There was an excellent Dinner/Dance at the Hotel on the Saturday evening greatly enjoyed by all the Teams and we returned to the Bowl on Saturday morning to start off with an easy win against Wiltshire with our lowest score of the weekend.

The Team positions remained unchanged as we went into Game Seven with another comfortable win against Co. Durham during which Doreen Lodge scored a 200 dead game. This was followed by a tense game against Staffordshire, who were making a late challenge, and the Kent Ladies triumphed by 730 to 690 with another 200 game from Doreen (201).

Meanwhile Essex were beating Yorkshire which meant Kent went into the final game leading by the slight margin of 31 pins shown in points as 70.90 to 70.59. The two contending teams were drawn on adjacent lanes and whilst Kent were involved in a tight game against Hampshire which they eventually won, Yorkshire stormed away with a high game of 753 against Lincolnshire to clinch the title by 45 pins and thereby retain their title.

All praise is due to the Kent Ladies who performed to a high level and should be proud of the silver medals they received. We must not forget Dot Edwards who bowled in the qualifying rounds but was unavailable for the Final.

The Men's Competition was of a very high standard and although Kent eventually finished in fifth position they were in close contention for medal positions throughout.

The first game was lost narrowly to Middlesex despite a 204 game from John Boulton but this was followed by two good wins against Essex and Dorset with total scores of 1053 and 1095 respectively in the five person Teams. John Boulton had a 230 game

against Essex, Ron Lovett consecutive games of 222 & 233, John Amos games of 205 & 203 and Tom McQuade a 239 game against Dorset and Chas Painter a 244. The next game versus Lincolnshire was lost by 12 pins, and then the final game of the day Kent went down to the eventual winners of the Tournament, Yorkshire by 982 to 1048, despite a game of 201 by Chas Painter.

Having lost three of their games on Saturday, Kent were relying on the right results from other Teams on the Sunday, but this did not happen although Kent won their first three games with 200 games from all including a 244 game by John Amos and 245 by Tom McQuade in the game against Northants contributing to a Team score of 1033.

The final game against Hampshire was lost by 49 pins, whereas a win could have seen Kent moving into third or fourth place. Nevertheless, we can look forward to next year with confidence taking into account the scores recorded by the bowlers representing the County. The individual scores of the Kent bowlers were:-

BERT & VICKY TIMMS MEMORIAL MIXED DOUBLES

Just ten days before this year's Mixed Doubles Tournament I rang the manager at Buggy's Bowl Cliftonville, Jackie Fenton, to talk over the very poor entry I had received and whether or not to drop some of the squads. From then on the telephone didn't stop ringing and the postman's sack got considerably heavier. I was amazed when by the end of Sunday we had actually achieved a record entry, 68 mixed doubles pairings. Such are the vagaries of tournament management!

The field was packed with both familiar faces and some new ones. A particular welcome being offered to several teams from Chelmsford in Essex, who had crossed the water to renew Inter-County rivalries that were established long before these particular bowlers had taken up the sport.

As in past years the event was split into three groups. Division A must have a combined total average of less than 310, Division B 311 to 350 and Division C 350 and above. The Bert & Vicky Timms Memorial Trophy being awarded to the team that beat their combined entering average by the most number of pins. Thus you do not necessarily have to be winning a group to collect the trophy.

The early squad often produces the eventual winners, but not this year! Unfortunately the only reward for those starting out early was that their names appeared on the scoreboard, for a little while anyway. The lower average group made the best start to the day, Kaye Cudmore and Alan Petherick whose 949 scratch was plus 46, just pipping Tony & Linda Robins 930, although the latter pair were +48.

Lucy Cudmore & David Percival woke up the second squad with David rolling a 632 in their 1152 series to lead Division C. Whilst in Division A Margaret and David Jerram showed real togetherness to record a 1022 series, both rolling a 511 series, setting the lead in this group which was to last until the last squad. They also led the race for the trophy with a score of + 92.

Division B was also being keenly contested with local bowlers John Boulton and Anne Seale holding off two teams by just 2 pins, having scored a 996.

The aforementioned Lucy switched partners and Divisions in squad three and promptly rolled a 579 series, which with Roy Memmott's 563 sent them soaring into the lead in Division B on a 1142 total and +107. In the lower division Terry & Jackie Pullinger rolled a 1010 set at +104 placing them second in the group, whilst at the opposite end of the centre Janet Tadd and Alan Openshaw were quietly amassing a +188 total of 980 which although not challenging for the prizes in their division, shot them into the lead by a long way in the hunt for the trophy. Janet has not been bowling long and she has a low average which reflects this, however in this tournament the lowest average bowlers often do come through to take the honours.

Despite Dad John and Fiancee David's best efforts Lucy had been unable to find a partner with an average at the right level for her to enter Division A (David in particular having ambitions for her to lead all three groups) and so "settled" for Kent Captain Keith Hodge as a partner in Division C. Despite Keith's 670 series they still fell two pins short of the leaders with a 1150 series. Jan Hodge partnering Neil Webb also fell just short on an 1143, but when husband and wife combined on the next squad the Division C result was re-written. Jan's 609 along with 576 from Keith was enough to take the group on an 1185 total. However it should be noted that the way this event was designed means that these high average bowlers were not in the chase for the trophy, as the "Hodges" were only +9 on their averages.

Other individuals were bowling well and many good games were recorded. Our youngest competitor this year was Janice Shephard of Cliftonville YBC who recorded a 472 series over 100

pins above average, something many of the adults would have been proud of.

On the last two squads our friends from Essex renewed their challenge and whether fortified by Buggy's provisions or the friendly atmosphere, improved considerably on their earlier performances. Michelle Hall & Peter Evans rolled a 1069 only to be beaten by team mates Caroline Woollard and Les Lane with a 1076 series in Division B.

By this time in the tournament all slots had been sold and many teams were disappointed not to be able to bowl again, I can only suggest that next year you either enter more than once or bowl earlier in the day giving you more chance of picking up another space.

The final squad of any tournament can often prove to be a bit of an anti-climax with everyone, bowlers and organisers becoming weary, however this was not the case this year. First Lucy Cudmore found another partner! This time Adrian Conner who rolled the second highest series of the day with a 642. Unfortunately Lucy had run out of steam and the last serious assault on the Division C title was past. Doreen Lodge and Terry Kochevar from Bexleyheath mustered a 1061 but fell just short of the prizes in Division B and so two groups were settled.

However Division A was not and the trophy's destination also changed. Despite having already bowled 6 and 9 games respectively **Tony & Linda Robins** saved their best performance for last. Tony's 495 was above average but Linda's 578 including a final game of 243 was to change everything. The 1073 series was 50 pins in front of their rivals in their group and they beat their averages by a massive 191 pins to become the 1997 holders of the Bert & Vicky Timms trophy.

Our congratulations to everyone who took part in making this a very enjoyable day once again, and special thanks to Jackie and her staff at Buggy's for making us so welcome.
