# KEITH HODGE WINS THE "IRISH OPEN".

KEITH HODGE, the Kent County Captain, had one of the best wins of his bowling career by taking the first European major Championship of 1998, the Pepsi Irish Open.

The event attracted a men's entry of 202 from all over Europe and at the end of the first session, the field was cut to 72 with England's Steve Gomershall and Keith in the top 10. It appears the scoring was quite high with Tore Torgerson from Norway bowling a 300 game to add to the many he has bowled in many tournaments.

The following day saw the field cut to 36 which included nine bowlers from England.

After a further four games, the event is down to ten finalists bowling a round robin to decide who progresses to the stepladder for the top four.

To make the final, the men were averaging 202 or better and in a very close run round robin, Keith Hodge was the only Englishman to reach the step-ladder in second place. The four to make the step-ladder were:-

Tore Torgerson [Norway] Keith Hodge [England] Philip Dunne [Ireland] Pierre Ravez [Belgium]

The Irish crowd at Stillorgan Bowl in Dublin were very noisy during the final stages particularly when local hero Philip Dunne beat Pierre Ravez 235-193.

The men's semi-final had the English and Irish camps trying to outcheer each other as Dunne disappointed his home supporters as Keith Hodge ran out the winner 235-187.

So Keith came up against Tore Torgerson in the final, a bowler for whom he has great respect. Going into the 10th, Torgerson had a double running, but he left the 3-10 baby split, which he'd already missed in the very first frame.

The Norwegian supporters couldn't believe that he would miss it again - but he did, finishing on 184. Keith still had to win the match, though. A spare and a strike were needed. He made the nine spare look easy enough. Now all he had to do was strike. He did and he was champion. A famous victory over a great bowler 185-184.

Well done, Keith, we are proud of your achievement.

# LARGEST ENTRY ever for INTER-COUNTIES "ROLL-OFF" to select the 1998 KENT Squads.

Great interest was shown this year in the "Roll-Off" for the County Teams which took place at Whitstable Bowl on two consecutive Sundays in February.

The Rules for the B.T.B.A. Inter-Counties state that a sanctioned Tournament must be held in a certified Centre. A maximum of 15 bowlers may be registered in each Division, from which the teams are selected. The agreed format in Kent is that six games scratch should be bowled, in doubles format, from which the top thirteen are automatically included in the squad and then two further competitors from the "roll-off" are selected by the County Organiser and Team Captain to complete the squad. The bowlers selected, together with their scores in the "roll-off" are detailed below by and the final two bowlers selected are indicated by \* instead of their score.

The first Sunday of 1998 saw the second Whitstable "Pick 'n' Mix" tournament take place with 45 bowlers from around the south-east pitting their skills against each other and then trusting to luck when the draw for the 'Baker System' second round took place.

After a 4-game handicap qualifier, the top eight ladies drew partners from the top eight men and played a one game head-to-head 'Baker' eliminator before the top four pairs played a

stepladder final.

For the men, Steve White had a sound and solid four games of 203,204,188 & 221 to lead the table with a 204 average - no mean feat at Whitstable! Chris Skudder followed, averaging 191, and rolling the tournament high game of 257, whilst local bowler Tim Beale took third spot.

For the ladies, Jennifer Clark surprised even herself with a super performance boosted by her high handicap to give the highest handicap total of the day - 850 over 4 games. Top local junior Helen Perkins rolled a 186 average for the second place with Tracey Dew taking third.

Although the qualifying round was handicap, it is interesting to note that 14 of the 16 qualifiers would have gone through if the scoring had been scratch.

To reach the fourth place in the stepladder final, Jan Hodge & Nathan Clark beat Jennifer Beale and Chris Skudder. In third spot, Jennifer Clark & Steve White defeated Kate Foxley & Keith Hodge. To take second place Helen Perkins & Adrian Conner beat Pat Blaber & James Pateman and to take pole position Tracey Dew & Ron Lovett beat Nikki Harvey & Tim Beale.

The stepladder final saw Jennifer Clark & Steve White recording two wins by beating Jan Hodge & Nathan Clark 166/154 and Helen Perkins & Adrian Conner 160/152 to reach the final game only to be comprehensively beaten by the winners Tracey Dew & Ron Lovett 191/126.
