I apologise that there has been such a delay in this edition being published. When I agreed to take over as Editor for Bowling News, I had not expected to be producing the next edition. Sadly, events have led to Jerry Lodge giving up the job with immediate effect.

A lot has happened over the months since the last issue and much of it is now "old news". However I feel it is important to publish at least the tournament results since that last issue, even if there is no full report. You will notice some changes to the format of Bowling News as I am using a different system to publish it. In the years that I have been on Council, the constant cry from Jerry Lodge was that people rarely submitted articles for Bowling News, but somehow he always managed to fill it! I hope that you will all help me to keep this publication up to the standard that has been maintained in the past.

Fundraising is an important issue. Our costs are increasing year on year, partly due to the success of our County Teams! We have now been asked to assist with funding for a YAC team in the coming year. Last year, the cost of running our Adult and Senior men and ladies teams was close on £4,000. If our County teams are not to become governed partially by players ability to pay for themselves, rather than by merit, we have to find ways of raising more money. Council member John Carr has been writing letters to many firms and organisations asking for sponsorship or donations. His efforts so far have met with limited success (see below). There are various ways we can advertise our sponsors, for example on shirts, in Bowling News or on our website. You will all have been approached at KTBA tournaments by Alan and his band of merry helpers to buy raffle tickets at times! Please do support these raffles as all monies raised are used to fund our County teams. Donations of raffle prizes will be gladly received by Alan.

So, do send me interesting reports from your leagues, tournament results, humorous stories, or just letters of general bowling interest, even if controversial! If you have any suggestions for topics you would like to see included in future issues, please let me know. (Contact details are on the front page).

A.G.M. REPORT 2002

There was a very good turnout for the AGM but it was disappointing that we had nobody new putting themselves forward for election onto Council. We have four unfilled spaces and several Kent centres currently without a representative on Council.

In his opening address the K.T.B.A. President, John Cudmore, thanked members of the Committee for the hard work that they had put in over the past year. He pointed out that we are moving towards everyone on Council having a role to play. He paid tribute to Jerry Lodge and thanked him for the invaluable contribution he has made over the years. (We will be featuring an article giving details of Jerry's various roles in the world of bowling in our next edition.)

County Treasurer, Christine Conner, presented the Accounts for the year. Copies were available for all present to see.

The Area Secretary, Rosemary Moll, then gave her report of events over the past year. She highlighted a successful year regarding Kent tournaments. The Inter Centre Tournament, held at Margate in July, had a record entry with nine out of the ten Kent centres taking part, Orpington being the one exception. The Area Championships also had a record entry with 38 teams taking part. The Bert & Vicky Timms tournament had also got underway this year after being cancelled last year due to lack of entries.

She also reported five 300 games that had been submitted in the past year. Stephen Letchford at Bexleyheath, Keith Porter at Chatham and three at Margate from Pete Williams, Daniel Harman and 15 year old Kevin Franks.

Paul Pateman presented his first report as Junior Sub-Committee Chairman, having taken up the position in June 2001. He reported on various tournament successes which have been fully reported in previous issues of Bowling News.

The most recent tournament was the Under 14's

Junior Counties held at Strykers Bowl, Tamworth. At the time of the AGM no official report had been received however Paul was able to inform us that the girls team had won plates for third place. Emily Frost had taken first place in the female section for both high game (259—a personal best) and highest average with 195 over 6 games.

Inter-County Organiser, Alan Petherick, reported on another successful year for the Kent Teams with three out of the four adult teams reaching the finals of the Inter-Counties tournament.

He reported on the results of the questionnaire requesting the bowlers' views on the Inter-County tournament and the selection process. Of the 120 completed forms, around 60% thought that the present system should remain unchanged. Of the 40% that suggested some changes, almost half suggested selection to the squad that would not fall within the remit of the tournament rules, and in some cases the timescale for registration of teams (such as considering scores from other KTBA tournaments the Areas for instance). The Inter-County rules state that a roll-off for selection purposes must be held giving equal opportunity to all BTBA members to represent their county. A maximum of 15 bowlers will be registered for each squad, of these only the top three must be asked to represent the county for at least two games, the rest of the team will be selected from the remaining 12 qualifiers. Alan pointed out that many things are taken into consideration during selection, not just the finishing position in the roll off. He summarised by highlighting the participating players and their achievements during the Inter-Counties rounds which have been fully covered in previous editions of Bowling News.

Alan concluded by thanking everyone who assisted him in running the tournament and helped to raise the necessary funds, not forgetting those who kindly donated prizes for the raffles.

OUIZ NIGHT

Following the A.G.M. there was a Quiz which had been organised by David Pitt and Doreen Belsom. Twelve teams took part and enjoyed an entertaining evening. Questions had been set on subjects varying from Music to Geography, Current Affairs to Stage and Screen. There was also a running round which required a knowledge of car models, both old and new. There were other fundraising efforts on the night and the County funds ended the evening about £150 richer.

Our thanks go to all those involved in organising the event, especially Doreen and Aubrey Belsom, who kept score, and David Pitt who was the Question Master for the evening. We hope to repeat the event next year—it would be nice to see even more of you taking part.

DOREEN LODGE

It is with deep regret and sadness that we report the death of a highly regarded member of the bowling fraternity, Doreen Lodge after a short illness, on February 27th.

Doreen had been bowling since the 1970s and was the long serving secretary of the Double TT's league at Bexleyheath. She was also a valued member of the Kent senior county team having bowled every year since its inception. She had a fun outlook on life, loved music and dancing and was extremely skilled at embroidery.

Our thoughts are with husband Jerry, daughters Christine and Elaine and their families in their bereavement. She will be sadly missed.

Perhaps that can best be summed up by two instances from the KTBA Masters events. In 1993 Mum won the Masters but in doing so had to beat her friend and doubles partner, Angie Thick, in the final. Although delighted to win her first reaction was to hug Angie and apologise for robbing her of victory. Mind you that didn't prevent her gently teasing Elaine and I by placing the trophy where we couldn't fail to see it whenever we walked in at home.

My bowling memories of Mum however will be summed up best by last year's Masters when for the second year running I met Elaine in the final. Someone asked Mum who she would be supporting. Despite her shock at the question she calmly replied that she would support both her daughters because it didn't matter who triumphed as we were all winners. That was the way it was with Mum, family first and bowling second, hopefully some of that has rubbed off onto us. It will be a long time before any of us will be able to get over not being able to share our daily triumphs or tribulations with Mum but knowing we won't be alone in remembering her really does help.

IANGES FOR THE KTBA MASTERS

Changes are taking place to the method of selection for invitation to the K.T.B.A. Masters event,

The invitation guideline up to and including this years Masters have been the defending master, the scratch singles and scratch all events champions from the previous years Area Championships and for the men the 600 Club Champion and for the Ladies the highest scratch score in the 500 Club Championships. The remainder being made up by the highest entering averages in that years Area Championships provided that they have entered the scratch all events. All of these at the discretion of the Tournament Manager.

Starting with the 2003 Area Championships, the Masters invitations will be still be given to four seeded men and ladies but instead of the averages for that years entry being considered, the invitations will be given to those who finished highest in the scratch all events at the proceeding years Area Championships. All this again is at the discretion of the Tournament Manager.

COACH AND FOUR TOURNAMENT 2001

The annual Coach and Four Tournament took place at Bexleyheath on three weekends just before Christmas. The 180 teams of five came from all over southern England; Kent was represented by teams from Cliftonville, Whitstable, Chatham, Orpington and Bexleyheath.

Each team is made up of four juniors and one instructor. If a junior beats the scratch score of the instructor in his team he is awarded a "I beat my Coach" badge. These badges are most sought after. The team event and individual event are both run on a scratch and handicap basis organised in divisions by age. Instructors being divisions 1 and 2 and the youngest bowlers being divisions 11 and 12.
