## KTBA INTER CENTRES – NOVEMBER 2004

On Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> November 2004 the Kent Inter-Centre Tenpin Bowling Championships, sponsored by Kent Messenger was held at AMF Bowl at Margate. The tournament was not held in 2003 due to scheduling and venue difficulties so defending Champions were Bexleyheath, who were victorious in 2002.

This year six of the nine centres in Kent entered teams. For each of the events points were awarded as follows: 9 for finishing 1<sup>st</sup>, 6 – 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4 – 3<sup>rd</sup>, 3 – 4<sup>th</sup>, 2 – 5<sup>th</sup> and 1 for 6<sup>th</sup>. At the end of the tournament, each team would discard their lowest score. The team with the highest points becoming champions for 2004.

The day commenced with the ladies and mens doubles events Whitstable had a superb start to the tournament taking 18 points for finishing top of both categories. Natasha Krajewska and Emily Frost, two of the county's promising youth bowlers, took part in the ladies doubles for Whitstable. Emily rolled a superb 579 series which included a game of 227. It was the second highest ladies series of the day. Amanda James (Chatham) rolled a personal best series of 563 which featured a high game of 237 (highest ladies game of the tournament).

The Whitstable men's doubles team were Pete Williams and Dave Ross. Dave Ross rolled the highest series of the day with a score of 632, comprising games of 189, 203 and 240. Pete Williams achieved a 575 series including a 207 game. The Margate team took second place, Matt Tomlin achieved a 588 series comprising games of 147, 221 and 220 and his partner, Ian Davis achieved a 554 series highlighted by a 204 game.

The next events were men's and ladies singles, once again being played at the same time. At the start of this event it was discovered that Margate's players had not yet arrived and reserves were drafted in to take their place. We have to thank Amanda Allerton and Russell Porter for standing in at such short notice.

In the ladies event Alex Reed was victorious taking the 9 points for Bexleyheath. She bowled the highest ladies series of the day with a super 583 series comprising games of 166, 197 and 220. Jenny Beale (Whi) was second, just 11 pins behind on 572 featuring a high game of 233.

In the men's event John T Smith (there are two John Smiths at CLI) won the event for Cliftonville. He got off to a superb start with a 259 game, which was the highest men's game of the day. He followed this with games of 200 and 169 for a 628 series. Alex Thistleton (BEX) came second by bowling a 613 series comprising games of 204, 246 and 163.

The next event was the Senior Trios. In this event men or ladies could take part but had to be over 50. A bonus pin would be awarded for each year over 50 e.g. a bowler aged 65 would have 15 pins added to their score for each game.

Cliftonville achieved another victory in this event. Their trio were Bob Potts, Chris Smith and Dave Buck. Team anchorman, Dave Buck was top scorer in the event with a 601 series starting with a 182 game followed by games of 202 and 217. The team scratch series was 1604 with 87 bonus pins added taking it to 1691.

Whitstable were second with 1580 plus 81 bonus pins giving them a 1661 total. Paul Clark achieved the highest game for his team with a 211 3<sup>rd</sup> game.
